These improvements made such beauties as Strauss waltz floats, Venetian gondolas, Guides of the Tide, Sea Rover, and the Phantom Fete in 1928.

Satire in 1939

Oregon's last parade on the race followed a mock procession called "Stars Fell on Ali Baba." The real Arabian Nights fete moved Saturday night, closing the weekend.
