ful operation of the Marshall Plan, the United States take the initiative in encouraging reciprocal trade by negotiating the reduction of tariff barriers.

That the law enacting the Marshall Plan exclude the demands for strategic materials for stockpiling by the United States.

That the participating nations under the Marshall Plan have an active voice in its administration.

That no government shall be excluded from Marshall Plan aid for political reasons.

That purchase of armaments with funds appropriated under the Marshall Plan shall be prohibited.
