Dear Senior:

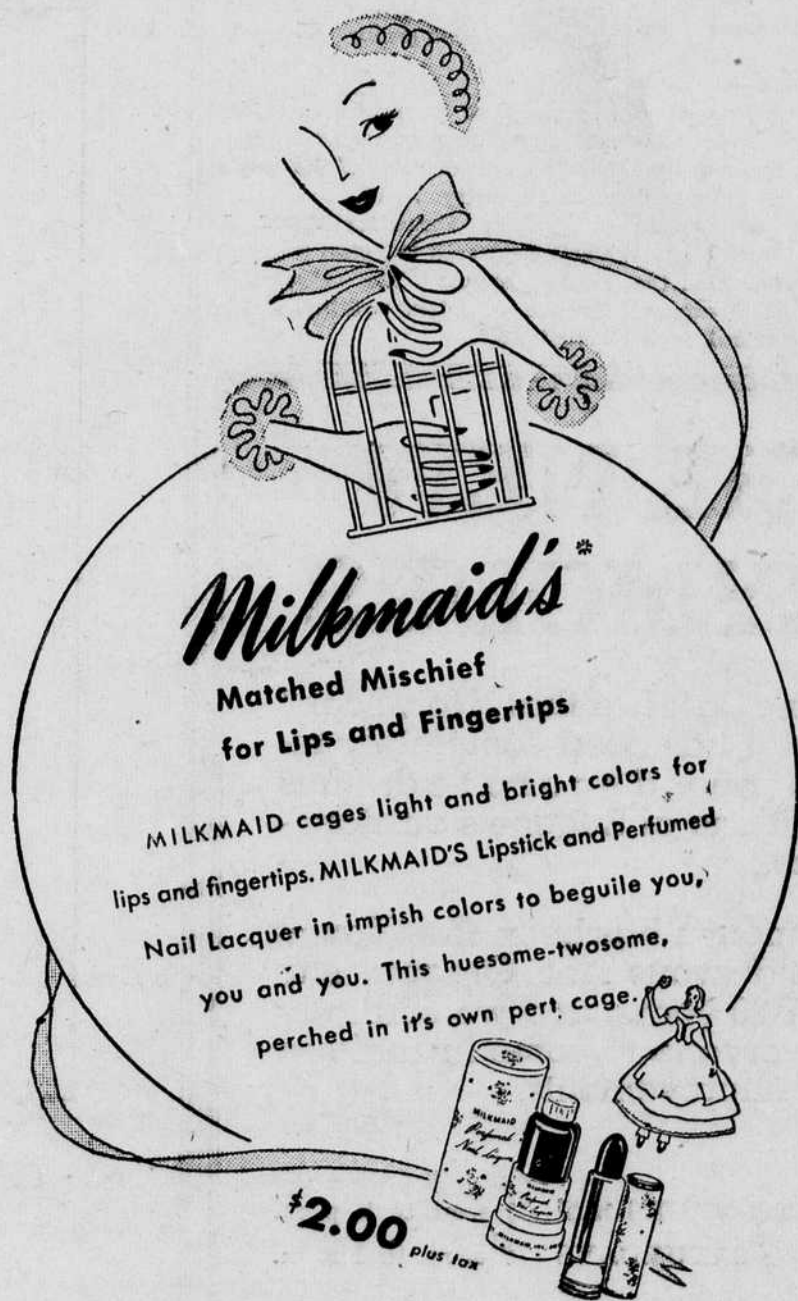
Now that Junior Weekend is over, I have time to send you this reminder.
