

Frog With 'Mental Superiority' Enters Famed Calaveras Derby

ANGELS CAMP, Cal., May 14—(UP)—Frog enthusiasts tonight were centering their attention upon the age-old question of brain power versus muscle power in the 21st renewal of the International Jumping Frog derby.

College of Pacific students at Stockton, Cal., came up with a surprise last minute entry named "Phi Beta Phrog" that they claimed would exert mental superiority to overcome the handicap of having only four legs.

Two five-legged jumpers have been entered by a pair of California scientists on the premise the extra push from the spare limb

should mean extra inches.

The extravaganza traces its origin back to Mark Twain's short story, "The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County," written nearly 100 years ago. And an estimated 35,000 persons are expected to jam this tiny hamlet over the weekend to see the show, and maybe wager a little money on their favorite frogs.

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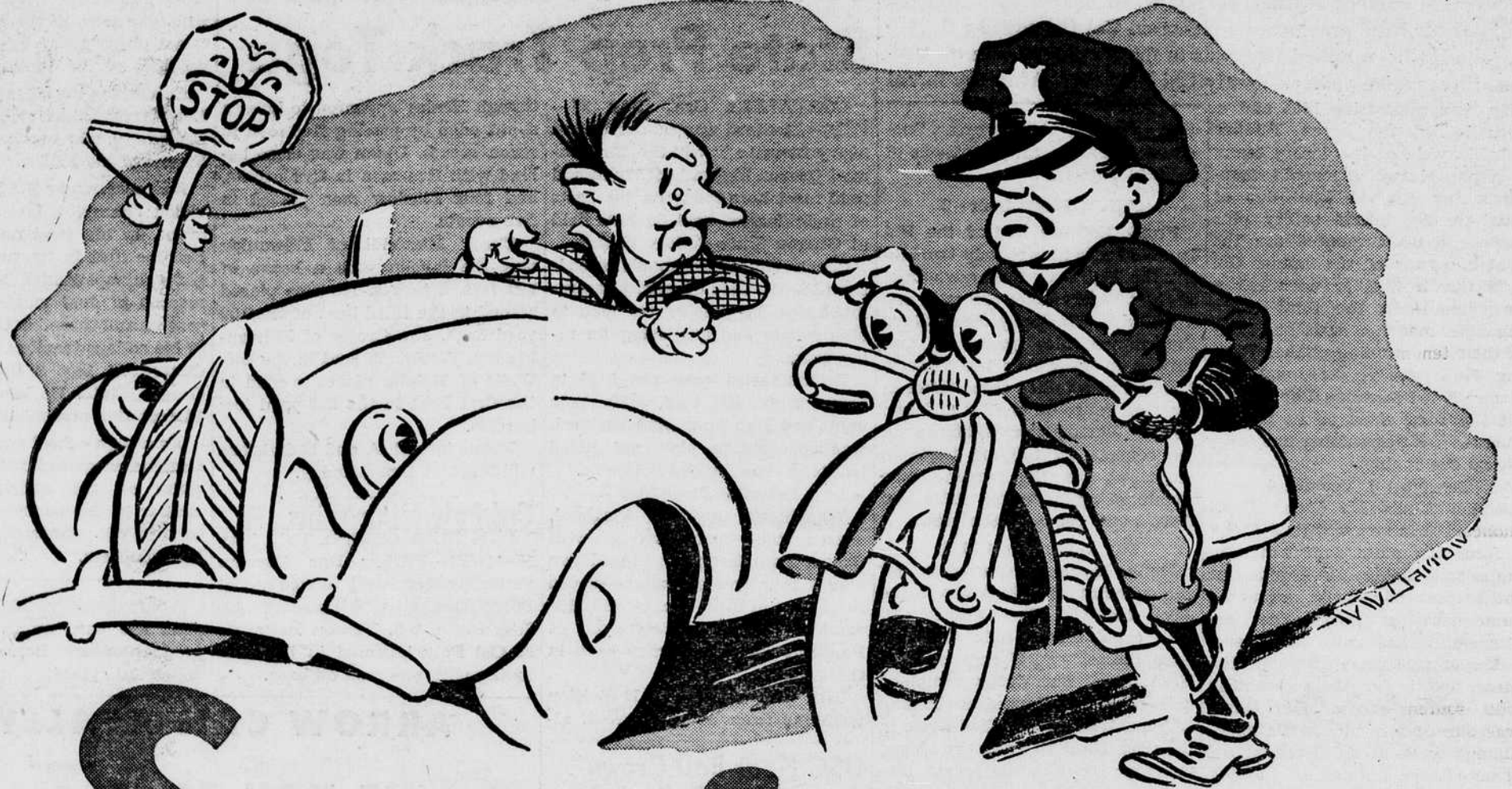
