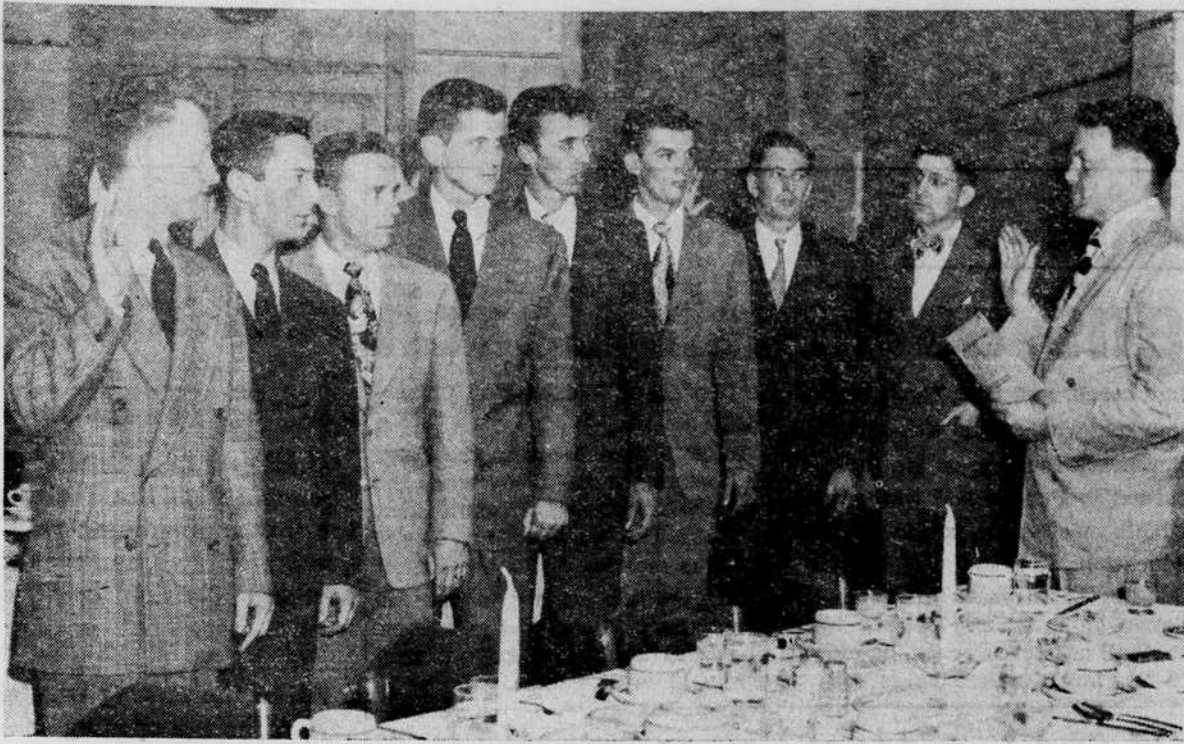


ADS Pledges Take the Vow
