MOSCOW, Ida., May 17-(UP) Bob Jorgensen, University of Washington hurler, struck out pinch-hitter Don Hunt with the bases loaded in the ninth inning to enable the Huskies to clinch a 5-3 baseball win over the University of Idaho here.

With the winning run on base, the strike-out was a heart-breaker to the Vandals who staged a strong rally in the closing inning. Washington made all five of its tallies in the first two innings.

Oregon State's scoring came on two walks, a single, and a sacrifice off Whitey Lokan, the winning pitcher.


### Meet Friday
