F. A. Cuthbert, professor of landscape architecture, this month has published an article in the Journal of American Water Works in which he discusses the subject of water departments in city planning.

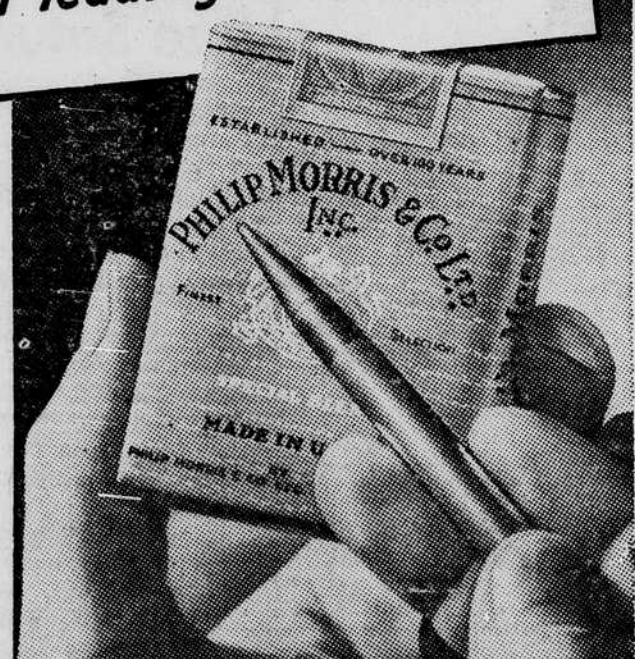
