

Spring Grades Highest During Year

Spring term all-university grades were slightly higher than those for last fall and winter terms, according to the registrar's office. All-campus average was 2.461, compared to 2.45 winter term and 2.353 fall term of 1947.

Pi Beta Phi sorority led the house grade list with 2.77. Second was University house, women's cooperative, with 2.736 and Delta Gamma sorority was third with 2.731. Last spring term's leader, Tau Kappa Epsilon fraternity, was fourth on the list, leading all other men's organizations with a 2.71 GPA.
