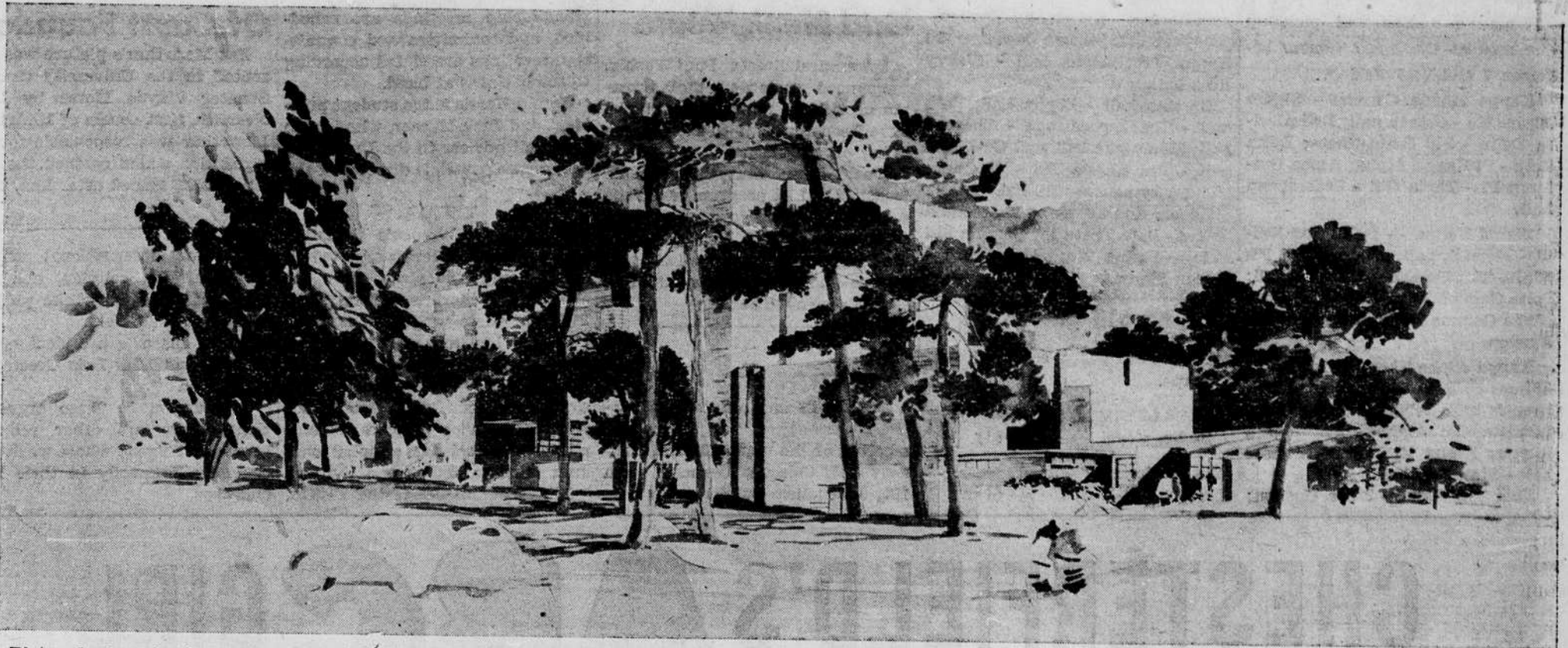


New Wing Rises on Ancient Villard Hall



Pictured above is the architect's drawing of Villard hall's extension. On the right is the new theater, which will have a seating capacity of 420. The wing will be built of reinforced concrete, and will be connected to Villard by a workshop. Villard hall will be remodeled inside to house the speech, drama and radio departments. Building Superintendent I. I. Wright estimated that the first and second floor classrooms of Villard will be ready for use by winter term. The theater should be completed by fall 1949. Construction was started early in July. Annand and Kennedy of Portland are the architects. Contractors are James and Yost of Portland.
