Kleinsorge to Organize UO Industrial Relations Institute

Dr. Paul L. Kleinsorge, associate professor, department of economics, announced today that on the basis of a \$1000 research grant from the University, the nucleus of a projected Industrial Relations Institute has been created in the department of economics.

With the aid of a graduate assistant, Steve Worth, Dr. Kleinsorge will, beginning this fall, collect and classify all collective bargaining agreements signed between employers and employees in the state of Oregon. The purpose of the projected institute will be to act as a reservoir and channel of information for business and labor in the state. Dr. Kleinsorge emphasized that the institute will be entirely non-partisan, has neither pro-labor nor pro-employer point of view.

Institutes now exist at the University of Washington, the University of California at Berkeley,

Kleinsorge hopes eventually to be able to do the same kind of work that these other schools are doing.

Dr. Kleinsorge also hopes to build an industrial relations library through the collection of all publications put out by both unions and management. He hopes for the cooperation of both trade union and management groups, emphasizing that the projected institute will be of practical value to the University, unions, and business.

YWCA to Open Membership Drive Monday

The annual membership drive of the YWCA will be launched Monday night, October 27, when junior advisers and cabinet members visit each women's living organization introducing the freshman students to the YWCA.

Shirley Lukins, drive chairman, stated that the membership goal has been set at 1000 new members. Transfer students who were members of a YWCA on a different campus are also asked to join, she said.

Each women's living organization has a Y representative and have been given registration cards. Any prospective member is asked to fill in the card and pay the \$1 registration fee. All registration cards are due at the Y bungalow by October 1, Miss Lukins said. Any new member may check the committees listed in which they are interested and all are invited to sign up for the commissions.
