

Wright Conducts Tour of Europe

Dr. Gordon Wright, associate professor of history at the University of Oregon, is one of seven faculty members from the United States who conducted 300 students on a recent tour of Western Europe.

The purpose of the excursion was to study the background of the E. R. P. in Western Europe and see what economical, political, and industrial problems exist that might be overcome by Marshall Plan aid. The trip was under the sponsorship of the University of Vermont.

Complex Problems Involved
Dr. Wright, who returned to the Oregon campus last week, said he had been impressed with the complexity of the problems facing Western Europe. He expressed the opinion that the Marshall Plan is

the only course open to the United States.

Students representing 200 different colleges from all parts of the United States made the six-month trip which started last July 1. Never before in history has as large a group attempted an excursion of this kind.

Various Stops Made

The group stopped in Birmingham, England, Leydon, Holland, Brussels, Belgium, and Paris, France to listen to reports from prominent officials and make first hand studies of the problems facing the people. They then split up into five groups which went into different sections of Western Europe to study the industrial problems.

Dr. Wright, in the position of a

faculty member, conducted lectures during the course of the trip. Students who participated in the project, which was a regular part of the University of Vermont's summer session, received college credit for their work. The University of Vermont hopes to make an annual affair of the excursion.
