the University again this year with a total of 2740 students enrolled. Second in enrollment is the school of business administration, which has a total of 1476 students.

The school of architecture and allied arts, with a record enrollment last year again topped its total by some 23 students. Last year's registration was 727, and this year the total number of art majors is 750.

Law School Shows Decrease

The school of law, showing a slight decrease, has a total of 418 students, and the school of health and education, lacking 2 from last year's total, has 250 enrollees.
