Construction of Polk Mountains

The second study, appearing in an Oregon bulletin, discusses details of the construction of the mountain region in Polk county in the area surrounding Dallas and Valsets. It is based on a map of the region. The State of Oregon department of geology and mineral industries also sponsored Dr. Baldwin in this study. Title of the pamphlet is "Geology of the Dallas and Valsetz Quadrangles, Oregon". Both studies are part of a project by the Oregon State department to survey and catalog the entire coast range. The United States Geological Survey also has a mapping program for the coastal range region, according to Dr. Baldwin.
