3. Advanced ROTC students will be deferred until the completion of their course, provided they maintain satisfactory grades in academic and military subjects. They will be expected to accept a commission in a reserve component after graduation, and will be subject to call for two years of active duty.

The duty period for veterans who enrolled in advanced ROTC before June 24, 1948, who had less than 90 days' active service will be 21 months. Veterans in advanced RO-TC who served 90 days or more will be subject to only 15 days of annual service in the reserve component.

4. Freshmen and sophomores in basic ROTC may indicate their desire for four years of military training at the University, agreeing to accept a reserve commission if tendered and to serve not less than two years if commissioned.

Deferment will probably be granted such students during standing in teh University.


