Sanders, Bell Lead Mighty Webfoots To Impressive Win

LOS ANGELES, Nov. 13-(AP)-Oregon's powerful football team scored a resounding 26-7 victory over UCLA last night and roared on to a possible New Year's Day date in the Rose

Maintaining a perfect slate in the six Pacific Coast Conference games, the good-looking Webfoots broke a 15-year jinx by whipping the Uclans in the Coliseum and hit the scoreboard for a touchdown in each of the four quarters.

The win left the Oregon eleven still neck and neck with California in the Coast drive for the Sanders hit center for a yard and Rose Bowl honor against the Big Nine New Year's Day.

UCLA Scores

The Uclans, trailing 26 to 0 midfield for the second time of the entire game and traveled 93 yards for their lone touchdown.



Sigma Chi stole the show from the other teams by turning in the first 15-0 round of the season, drubbing SAE 15-0 and 15-6.




