"Miracle in Paradise Valley," voted the outstanding public relations film made during 1947, will be shown in Room 3, Fenton hall at 4 p. m., Friday.

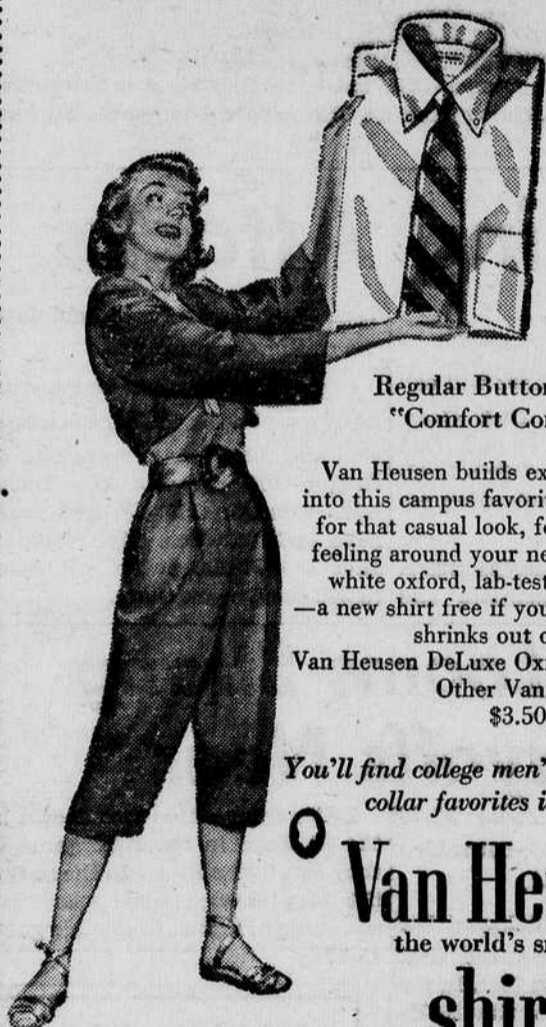
