

Atomic Radiation Speech Slated

Dr. H. J. Muller, 1946 Nobel prizewinner in medicine, will be on the Oregon campus Monday to speak on "Radiation Damage of Genetic Origin". He is sponsored by the Oregon chapter of Sigma Xi, national science honorary.

Dr. Muller will discuss the effects of the atomic bomb and X-rays on future generations. The speech is scheduled for 8 p. m. November 27 in room 207, Chapman hall. It is open to the public.

Considered by science department officials as perhaps the most important man on the campus in years, Dr. Muller is noted for his experiments with the fruit fly. He was elected president of the Eighth International Congress of Genetics in Stockholm this year. Now a professor of zoology at Indiana University, he was one of the authors of the study, "Mechanics of Mendelian Heredity," and is now considered the leading authority in that field.

World Headlines

WASHINGTON, Nov. 18.—(AP) The air force today set up the continental air command to direct the nation's air defense.

Lt. Gen. George E. Stratemeyer was named head of the new command, which will have headquarters at Mitchell air force base in New York.

The super-headquarters will have over-all direction of the present air defense command (the fighter force) and the tactical air command (the light bomber and attack-bomber force). The two commands will continue as operating organization

The re-organization also will do two other things:

1. Make the six air force areas of the United States coincide geographically with the six army commands. This is aimed at better co-

ordination with the army and navy in national defense.

2. Bring training and control of the two civilian forces, the air national guard and air reserve, under closer coordination through the continental air command and the six air force area commands.

The new command is similar to the strategic air command, which is set up to direct aid strikes beyond the United States. The SAC

is now based here, but is moving its headquarters to Omaha.

In the new setup, the following air force and army command areas will have the same geographical limits:

The six air force area commands will be directly responsible for air national guard and air reserve training programs in their areas, under the general supervision of the continental air command.
