Playing comedy is a challenge, according to Sas, since audience reaction must definitely be taken into consideration. Especially in the case of laughs, "don't worry, I'm expecting them, if I have to run down to the footlights and lead the paying customers in the laughter," when the actor must time his speeches so as not to over-run.

"There have been times," Sas admits, "when I thought the only people laughing were those on the stage. However, it was heartening during rehearsals to have other members of the cast sit in the audience and to hear them laugh at the action on stage in which they did not appear. .. To reciprocate, I sat out front and laughed at the right times for them. This acting," she muttered with a shake of the head, "is hard business."


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


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
