

## Organizations Elect Officers February 23

Election of officers for the YWCA, AWS, and WAA was set for February 23 at a meeting of representatives of the three organizations recently.

"We agreed that on that date to avoid what happened last year," said Laura Olson, president of the YWCA. "Last year there was loss of time, the programs had to be altered, and the election was postponed until spring term."

The earlier election date will give an opportunity for the new officers to work under the supervision of retiring officers for a longer period of time. They will not take office this year until after the installation ceremonies, and the new AWS officers will wait until after AWS weekend in spring term before taking office, Rene Cowell, vice president of AWS, said.

The representatives are hoping this date will not conflict with any house office elections. Miss Cowell said Monday that this will give them a chance to know if they will be holding a campus position before accepting an upper house office.
