Soprano Claire Lewis to Give Senior Recital Thursday Night

Soprano Claire Lewis, University student Claire Lewis, soprano, will give her senior recital at the music school auditorium, at 8 p.m. on Thursday, January 13.

Miss Lewis, who has been active in UO musical circles during her years on the campus, will present a four-part program, which will include numbers by Scarlatti, Richard Strauss, Ravel, and others. The program will be concluded with several English-language numbers, among which are "The men from the valley of apple pie," and "The man with the jelly-bean nose," both by Fenner.

Among her past musical activities, Miss Lewis includes a part in last year's Beggar's Opera, two performances at homecoming games, radio work, and work with the UO concert band. She will take

the lead in "The Telephone," which is tentatively scheduled for May.

"I plan to go into music professionally after graduation," she reveals. "I don't know just what phase of the field yet—you never know—it depends upon the breaks." But she states very definitely that "it won't be teaching!"

In addition to her musical activities, Miss Lewis takes an active interest in dramatics. Her accompanist for the recital will be Margaret Adkins.
