The house un-American activities committee decided yesterday to bar broadcasts and picture-making from all of its future hearings.

The decision was announced by Chairman Wood (D-Ga) after the first meeting of the committee since Democrats took over its control. He said the vote was unanimous.

In the past, the committee's hearings often have been televised and broadcast and displayed in the newsreels.

The committee also designated three of its members to confer with Attorney General Tom Clark but Wood would not explain the nature of the mission.
