Saturday is the last day to drop courses, Clifford Constance, registrar, stated in a reminder to the student body yesterday.

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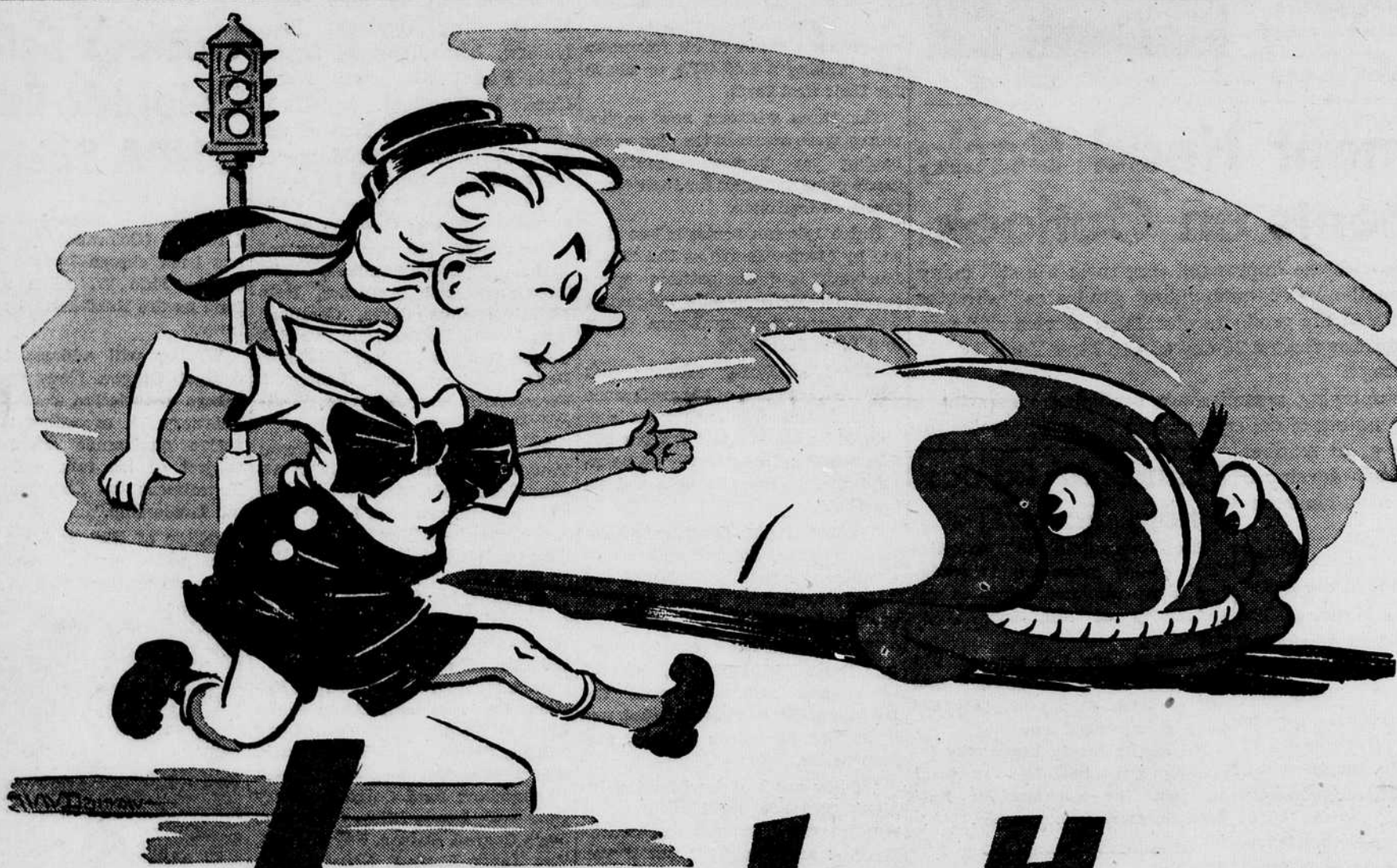
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LITTLE JACK HORNER
