

Aquaducks Wallop OSC 72-12 in Last Dual Meet

Last Saturday afternoon in the Oregon State College men's pool this year's edition of the Oregon Aquaducks wound up their dual meet competition with a fine 72-12 trouncing of the Oregon State swimming team. They had earlier beaten the Beavers 74-10.

ALTHOUGH THE POINT totals show the victory to have been an easy one for the Ducks it does not show that the varsity does not definitely off. Coach John Borchardt will have plenty to say about that this week in the men's pool as the team prepares for Friday's and Saturday's Northern Division championships.

LEADING THE Ducks were Louis Santos and Earl Walter. Santos was high point man winning the 220-yd. freestyle, the 100-yd. freestyle and anchoring the final winning relay team.

Walter came through with a fine leg on the winning relay team, a second in the 150-yd. backstroke, and a record smashing day in the final event of the day.

It was in the 200-yd. individual medley that Walter set another record which has become one of the bywords of this year's team. He easily broke the existing standard of Hannula from WSC by ten seconds.

Following last weekend's even split with Oregon State, the Oregon Webfoots took things easy yesterday, resting up for the first serious workout of the week, this afternoon.

The Ducks, now mathematically eliminated from the title struggle, are still in a position to throw the race into a playoff, if they win both games from Oregon State and Washington State sweeps their series with Washington.

Saturday night the Webfoots were slowed down by an effective zone defense thrown up by the Beavers and got few shots at the bucket. The Corvallis team was all over Roger Wiley, holding the loop's leading scorer to only seven points. Guard Paul Sowers dunked in nine tallies to pace the Webfoots in the 42-38 setback.

Cliff Crandall paced the Beaver win with 13 tallies.

Oregon came through the weekend with no injuries, but Oregon State was more unfortunate. Forward Glen Kinney was carried from the floor Saturday night with a broken ankle and will be lost for the season.

The 6-foot 3-inch sophomore had been relegated to a reserve role in the Webfoot-Beaver series, after playing much of the season as a regular. How much his loss would hurt the Slats Gill-coached quint is uncertain.

The top Orange scorer, Cliff Crandall, sat out of drill yesterday

with a cold. He is expected to be ready to go on Friday night, however.

GILL SENT HIS squad through a long and rugged workout yesterday. He plans to tie up the title as soon as possible, which would mean winning Friday night here in Eugene. The Beavers need to post only one more victory to win, and Gill would like to tie up the race as soon as possible.

Though losing ground to Eddie Gayda Saturday night, Webfoot center Roger Wiley still held to his Northern Division scoring lead with 193 tallies. He needs 22 more to break the individual scoring record for Oregon that he set last year when he chalked up 219 points.

GAYDA OUTSCORED Wiley Saturday night by making 17 points to Wiley's seven. The Duck star now has a 13 point lead over the Cougar ace.
