The lecture, being sponsored by Sigma Psi, national science honorary, will be open to all students and general public, according to word received from Dr. E. G. Ebbighausen, associate professor of

Cosmology, which is the study of the properties and structure of the universe, has received much public attention recently with the installation of the 200-inch telescope atop Mt. Palomar.

One of the reasons construction of the huge instrument was undertaken was to implement study in this field. Scientists hope it will aid them in determining whether the universe is finite, whether the nebulae are receding, as has been theorized.

Dr. Omer came to Oregon last fall from the California Institute of Technology, where he worked with the eminent cosmologist, Dr. Richard Tolman.
