VA Explains Missing Checks

Absence of many subsistence checks from yesterday's mail was attributed to failure by veterans to report changes of address to the Veterans Administration. Thousands of veterans failed to receive checks last month because of this neglect, a V.A. report indicated.

Since the post office department cannot deliver a government check to an address not occupied by the payee, many checks are returned to the treasury department disbursing offices. They in turn forward the check to the VA who holds the check until the veteran reports.

Because of the long delay involved in returning checks to "missing" veterans, the VA urged that all changes of address be reported promptly.
