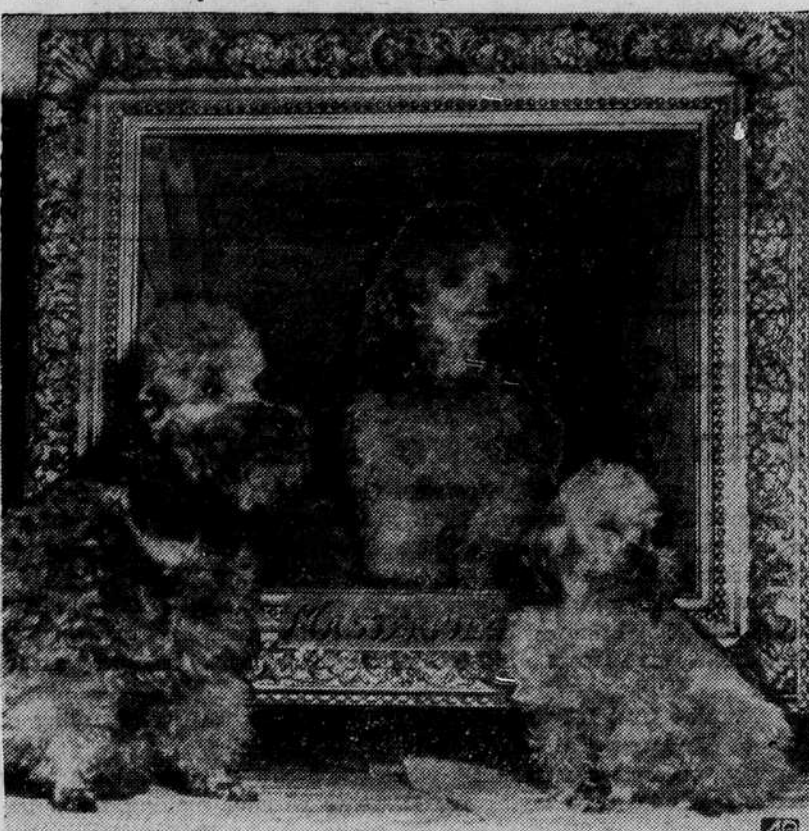

Women's Organizations Hold Joint Installation

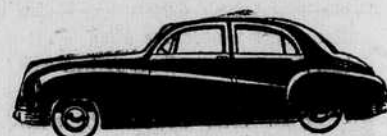
