

Coalition Party Meets To Drum Participation

The USA council, composed of interested people from all non-Greek bloc living organizations, met last night to familiarize students with USA and encourage maximum student participation in the forthcoming campus elections.

"We are trying to build interest in the coming elections," Walt Freauff, USA president, explained. "We want to get people out to vote. In the past, seldom more than 50 per cent of the student body participated in elections."

Bob Miller, chairman of the council, explained the USA nominating procedure and urged the representatives to stimulate interest in petitioning within their

living organizations.

The USA nominations procedure was mapped out at the meeting.

Petition deadline is set for noon April 9. The following day executive council petitioners will be interviewed at 3:15 p.m. at the Phi Kappa Sigma house. Class office petitioners will be interviewed on April 12.

The first general assembly, at which nominations will be presented, and accepted from the floor, will be held April 14. The second general assembly for final nominations and selection of candidates will be April 19 in McArthur court.

Petitions may be turned in at the ASUO president's office in Emerald hall, or to any member of the steering committee. Steering committee members were listed in Thursday's Emerald. Petitions should be accompanied by an eligibility slip from the dean's office. Bob Miller, co-publicity chairman of the USA explained ASUO requirements.

The ASUO constitution provides in Section 3, clause 1, that any student who has completed at least three terms at the University and who has 110 credit hours is eligible for number 1 and 2 positions ASUO and senior class offices.

Two terms at the University, not less than 74 hours and no more than 110 are required for junior class offices. Those petitioning for sophomore class offices should also have completed two terms at the University, and also have completed at least 24 hours, but no more than 73 hours.
