Duck Golfers Face Victoria In Lid-Lifter

Oregon's top four golfers left the Eugene campus Wednesday morning for an auto junket to Victoria, B. C., where they will test their drivers, putters, and tees for the first time this season in a Saturday match against Victoria College.

The quartet, composed of Dwayne Omlid, John Eckstrom, Fred Zolezzi, and Dom Provost will meet their coach, Sid Milligan, at Victoria. Milligan left earlier this week to participate in a Canadian meet, also at Victoria.

The top four king-pins arrived on top by blasting their way through the qualifying rounds.

Omlid topped the field with a 288 in the 72-hole grind, with Eckstrom posting a 292, Zolezzi a 294, and Provost a 297.

Jack Gaudion landed in fifth position with a 302, while the usually steady John Prince was sixth with a score of 306. Bob Sederstrom, Rex McDowall, and Jim Donahue all notched 307's to wind up in a three way tie for seventh spot. Al Riebel notched a 308 for tenth position. These ten men compose the varsity golf squad, the top four playing in matches away from home.

Ducks Outlast Idaho, 18-13, As Teams Commit 16 Errors; Mills Checks in for Victory

Idaho out-slugged and out-errored the Webfoots yesterday, yet lost an 18-13 marathon to the run-happy Kirschmen. The victory gave the Ducks a perfect two-win record in Northern Division competition.

The two teams put on a good show of boot-me-around-again-Willie, Idaho committing ten errors and Oregon contributing six. It was anything but a day for the pitchers, as both coaches paraded three men to the hill, in a drawn out 2 hour-50-minute session.

IN SCORING in every inning but the fourth, the Webfoots were still on the short end of the hitting ledger with 11 safe blows to the Vandals' 15. Making use of four Idaho miscues, the Ducks managed a pair of markers in each of the first three frames to lead 6-1.

Idaho gave starting Webfoot hurler Homer Bropst the shower signal in the fourth frame, bunching three hits for a like amount of runs.

Dick DeBernardi took over the hurling chores in the fifth frame, and Chuck Finley's lads promptly knocked the cover from his offerings.

THE VANDALS bunched four hits, including Nick Stallworth's triple and capitalized on two Oregon errors (DeBernardi being charged with a three-base boot) for five runs and a 9-6 lead before Don Kirsch waved Sid Mills in from the bull pen.

Smarting from the Idaho upsurge, the Webfoots immediately teed off on Ozzie Knikkeberg for six tallies and a 12-9 bulge.

In the bottom half of this nightmarish inning, the first man, Dick Bartle, scored when the Vandal centerfielder dropped his deep fly.

Don Kimball pounded a triple to deep left center, and after Don Dibble's groundout, Walt Kirsch walked. Hal Torkelson was safe on Stall-

worth's error, Kimball scoring. **MILLS** sacrificed the runners along, and Johnny Kovenz walked to fill the bases.

Hal Zurcher slapped a single between first and second, batting in two markers. Al Cohen's long double scored the final two runs.

Mills kept the Vandals pretty much on the hip with his dipsy-doo curves until the ninth inning, when

the Moscow squad made a belated four run assault.

HE GAINED credit for the verdict, while Knikkeberg was charged with the loss.

Cohen and Kimball wielded the big guns for Oregon, Cohen batting in five runs on two doubles and a single, with Kimball slugging a two-bagger and a triple:

BOWERMAN has a full squad, however, and will be relying heavily on field events to gain a lot of points. Marvin, Almand, and Ed Robison will be doing the pole vault. Robison will also high jump with the help of team mates Smith, Soresby, and Elliott.

For the discus there will be Langer and Craig both of whom will also throw the shot put. Frosh Javelin thrower Chuck Missfeldt will be a heavy favorite to take that event.

Bowerman is counting on Jones, Wilson and Timms in the 100-yard sprint with Jones and Almand in the 220-yard event. Bill Soresby and Tom Elliot will be the frosh's main representatives in the 440.

THE HURDLES will be cleared by Soresby, Risley, and Joyce in the highs, while Smith, Singler and Elliot will take the lows.

The distances will be run by Bachlund and Picket in the mile with Hamilton and Braedetich filling up th ehole in the 880 left by Hutchins.

Vandal Dual On Saturday For Oregon

Oregon's thinclads went through a light, form-perfecting workout yesterday afternoon as they added the finishing touches in preparation for their first dual meet of the season against the University of Idaho on Hayward field.

Saturday's clash marks the second time the two schools have met in dual track competition.

THE WEBFOOTS captured the first encounter held in 1947 by a score of 79-52.

Several dual records are almost certain to fall by the wayside since the meeting of the schools is short on history.

George Rasmussen, Oregon's stellar vaulter, is almost assured of topping his 1947 mark of 12 feet, 9 inches as are Don Pickens and Lloyd Hickok, depth men in the event.

RAVEY HENTHORNE is another Duck who could shave time off his present record in the century, which now stands at 10.1.

Woodley Lewis looks like a cinch to chalk up a new mark in the broad jump.

Don Pickens now holds the record with a jump of 21 feet 3½ inches while Lewis has been leaping over 22 feet consistently in practice sessions.
