Two naval reserve officers from the Naval Officer Procurement office in Seattle will be on the campus today, tomorrow, and Thursday to speak to and interview students interested in commissions in the naval reserve and regular navy.

This morning at 9 in the graduate placement office Lt. Commander L. W. Fischer and Lieutenant W. E. McCready will speak, providing information on some twenty programs in medicine, dentistry, aviation, business administration, sciences related to medicine, and other special fields.

Both officers will be available for interviews from 9 to 5 in the graduate placement office all three days.

"The majority of these commissions require four years of college training; however, some reserve programs are available to undergraduates," Fischer stated yesterday.

Debaters Take Third in Contest

Oregon debaters Fred Risser and Jim Tucker took third place honors in the northwest Tau Kappa Alpha intercollegiate speech tournament held at Montana State university April 15 and 16.

Washington State college and Oregon State took first and second place respectively.

Risser and Tucker completed the six preliminary rounds of debate with the highest team rating of the 36 different lower division teams. Oregon's lower division team gathered a total of 27 out of a possible 30 points to maintain a superior rating.

Parliamentary style debating was used for the first time this year.

The national debate question, "Resolved, that the federal government should adopt a policy of equalizing educational opportunities in tax supported schools by means of annual grants," was the subject of the debate.

Senior Six Member Dies

Word was received Wednesday of the death of John Malik in the east. A political science major, Malik was a member of Phi Beta Kappa and Senior Six.

A resident of Elyria, Ohio, Malik had been sponsor in the dormitory system for some time until his withdrawal from school early in the fall. He was operated on in Portland at the Veterans hospital and then went home when told he had only three months to live.

Malik was sponsor of Villard hall when the crowded housing situation in the fall of 1947 made its use as a dormitory necessary. Later he was a sponsor in Sigma hall at Straub and Stan Ray in the Vets dorm.

Malik was 27, a veteran of army service in the European theater.
