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Operas to Be Shown By Chamber Series

Three short comic operas will be presented by University music students under the sponsorship of the Chamber Concert Series association on May 3, 4, and 5 at 8:15 p.m. in the school of music auditorium.

First of the three operas is "The Maid as Mistress" by Pergolesi. Written in the early 1700's, the production was one of the first humorous Italian operas.

"There and Back" by Hindemith, a modern German composer, is unusual in that the action proceeds normally until a certain point in the story and then completely reverses itself. The music, as well as acting, is reversed and the opera ends at the beginning.

The most recently written of the operas is "The Telephone" by Menotti, an American composer. Originally written for radio and produced over the air, the opera later enjoyed a successful run on the stage in New York City.

Music for the operas will be provided by members of the University orchestra, with a small group playing for each of the productions.

Tickets for the performances, priced at \$1.20 each, including tax, can be obtained in the Co-op from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. and in Miller's department store from 11 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Chamber Concert Series season ticket holders must exchange their original tickets for others entitling them to attend one of the three nights. These exchanges, which must be completed before April 25, can be made in the Co-op and Miller's during the previously stated hours.
