

Soph Men To Present Award

Applications for the William Frager memorial scholarship, awarded to an outstanding sophomore man by Skull and Dagger, sophomore men's honorary must be turned in by noon Thursday according to honorary president Barry Mountain.

The scholarship will be a three-term full tuition award in memory of William Frager, class of '39, who was killed in action over France during the last war.

Applications may be obtained from Mountain at the ATO house. To be eligible, an applicant must be a male member of the class of '51, have attended the University for the past five consecutive terms, have a GPA cumulative of 2.75 or better, and be registered as a regular resident student.

Decision Due on Building Site

The fate of the University's proposed science building will be decided at a meeting of the State Board of Higher Education, Lyle Nelson, head of the University's office of information, said today.

At the same time, the board will examine drawings of the new heating plant. Appropriations for the plant's construction have already been approved.

A committee which included Irwin I. Wright, head of the physical plant, and R. T. Ellickson, associate dean of the graduate school of physics, was in Portland yesterday discussing plans with Lawrence, Tucker, and Wallman,

architects, who have prepared the plans for the science building.

The main task of the committee will be to revise earlier plans for the building, to fit current budget allowances. If the board approves the revised plans, the University expects to receive a final budget approval on or after July 16.
