Students Show Musical Skill, Comedy in Operas

Hilarious comedy, combined with excellent singing and acting, was displayed by University music students in their presentation of three short operas in the music school auditorium last night.

"The Maid as Mistress" by Pergolesi, centers around the various contrivances employed by Zerlina, the maid, to gain the love of her employe and guardian, Dr. Pandolfo. Treva Rice aptly portrays the scheming, but likeable, maid and Wayne Sherwood exhibits talent as the fidgety, easily excited doctor.

Aiding Zerlina in her plan to gain Pandolfo's affection is the mute servant, Scapin. Well portrayed by Elden Pentilla, Scapin poses as Zerlina's lover from the Bulgarian army. Pandolfo becomes jealous and, after much indecision, asks Zerlina to marry him.

Gaudy Colors, Wild Music

A complete change of atmosphere is found in Hindemith's "There and Back." Bright gaudy colors and fast, wild music accompany the fantastic drama.

In the short space of 15 minutes Robert, portrayed by Lowell Chase, brings his wife Helene, Dorothy Gangnath, a gift, shoots her, commits suicide, and then runs back through the entire story, ending with the beginning. Assisting Hel-

ene and Robert in their fine acting and singing are Jean Young as the maid, Robert Roberts as the doctor, and William Putnam as the orderly.

Events Ignored

Instigator of the whole story reversal is the Celestial Ambassador, William Smith, who has the power of life and death. Throughout the entire story and its consequent reversal back to the beginning, Aunt Emma, played by Sue Judd, sits quietly in a corner knitting.

"The Telephone," by Menotti, concerns a young man, Ben, trying to propose to his sweetheart, Lucy, just before catching a train. Lucy, ably enacted by Claire Lewis, receives phone call after phone call in her apartment while James McMullen, as Ben, impatiently waits his opportunity. Ben finally gives up and calls Lucy, proposes, and she accepts. Lucy's exaggerated phone conversations are especially good, and Ben's anxiety is well displayed.

Gelhausen Directs Operas

Produced by Herman Gelhausen, assisted by Florence Vanderwicken and Edmund A. Cykler, the operas are accompanied by members of the University orchestra.
