Glinka, an early 19th century composer, was the founder of the modern nationalistic school of Russian music today. His work has influenced such composers as Moussorgsky and Rimsky-Korsakoff.

Two operas considered among his best accomplishments are "Life

of the Czar" and "Russian and Ludmilica."
