


Ford Negotiations Postponed

Law Student Held Guiltless Of Abduction

The jury Tuesday night returned a verdict of not guilty in favor of the defendant Frederick Starkweather in a suit brought to court by John Hill. The plaintiff alleged false imprisonment and assault and battery during the Law School Weekend April 30.

This was the third in the series of fictitious trials presented by the third-year law students.

The plaintiff claimed that the defendant forcibly removed him from the steps of Fenton hall during the coronation festivities. Hill was a flower girl participating in the coronation ceremonies.

Henry Hess and Clayton Hess, witnesses for the plaintiff's case claimed that although Hill was intoxicated at the time, he performed his duties in an acceptable manner. The counsel for the plaintiff stated that Hill's removal from the coronation caused him embarrassment and humiliation.

Witnesses for the defense, Avery Combs and David Williams, said that Starkweather took Hill into the building to prevent him from injuring himself and others. In addition Starkweather claimed he did this to prevent "the danger to future Law School Weekends."

Further law school trials will be held at the county court house tonight and Thursday night at 7:30.
