

Campus Published Magazine Lists Varied Articles On World Literature

An article entitled "Lettres de Tourgueneff a Henry James" heads the list of contents of the recently published summer issue of Comparative Literature. This is the third issue of the magazine, published by the University and edited by Chandler B. Beall, professor of romance languages. The series of letters addressed to James by Tourgueneff, or Turganef as his name is spelled in English, has never been published before. The original letters are in the Houghton Library at Harvard. The commentary and most of the letters are in French, "These letters aren't world-shaking, but they do throw a little light on the relationship of these men," explained Dr. Beall.

The second articles, "Comprensione e fortuna di Shakespeare in Italia," presents a survey of the popularity and influence of Shakespeare in Italy, particularly in the last two centuries. Written by Piero Rebora, a professor at the University of Florence, the study includes the Italian critics who have expressed judgements on Shakespeare, and Italian playwrights and composers who have utilized some of Shakespeare's themes. Several paragraphs on Giuseppe Verdi have been included.

"The Epic Style of the Pilgrim Aetheria" by Leo Spitzer, is an analysis of a description in Latin of the journey made by a nun to the Holy Land in the Sixth Century. Dr. Beall said, "It points out that the Latin style of this document has certain characteristics which show up later in medieval French literature." The author, Professor Spitzer of Johns Hopkins University, is one of the leading scholars in the field of linguistics and stylistics.

TRAGEDY ANALYZED
A discussion of certain aspects of the tragedy of "Phedre" by Racine, is conducted by Marcel Chicoteau in "Phedre et les poisons: Un theme de mediation tire d'Euripide." Chicoteau, who during the war, edited a journal of "Comparative Literature Studies," connects "Phedre" with its Greek sources, particularly in Euripides.

The latest in a long series of articles by Joseph G. Fucilla is "The Pedigree of a 'Soneto a lo divino.'" The discussion, which concerns the relation of Spanish lyrics of the Renaissance to the Petrarchian tradition and the Italian Petrarchist sonneteers, shows how numerous

Petrarchian love lyrics were rewritten with religious themes and subject matter in the time of the counter-reformation.

Book reviews in the magazine include Whitman Books and Articles (G. W. Allen), "Theory of Literature" by Rene Wellek and Austin Warren (H. H.), "Bibliography of French Translations of English Works," by Charles a. Rochedieu, (E. G. Cox), "Peretz, translated and edited by Sol Liptzin (Milton Hindus), "Jephthah and his Daughter" by W. O. Sypherd (C. G. Loomis), and "The Tristan and Isolde" of Gottfried von Strassburg," translated by Edwin H. Zeydel (Richard Jente).

TO HONOR GOETHE
The next issue of Comparative Literature will honor the bicentenary of the German poet, Goethe. The articles will include: "Goethe und die Schweiz" by Fritz Strich; "Literary Relations in the Light of Goethe's 'Wiederspiegelung'" by L. A. Willoughby; "Goethe hom-

me du milie," by Edmund Vermeil; "Croce as a Critic of Goethe," by Lienhard Bergel; and "George Ticknor's 'Sorrows of Young Werter'" by Frank G. Ryder.

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'Little America' Visited by USSR Claims Byrd

NEW YORK, Oct. 13 — (UP) — Rear Adm. Richard E. Byrd said tonight that he had information that the Russians had visited "little America" near the South Pole in unnamed ships and had used powerful airplanes in exploration activities there.

Byrd, who has explored both North and South polar areas, did not disclose where his information was obtained.

He said, however, that there have been reports that uranium, the material from which atom bombs are made, can be found in the "little America" regions, some of which are as large as the United States and have never been explored.

Byrd said that another projected expedition by the United States to the South polar areas is now under consideration by the Joint Chiefs of Staff and that despite two previous turn-downs of his plan to return to the South pole the project is not "dead."

Byrd was in New York tonight to receive a scroll presented to him by the Hayden Planetarium in recognition of his pioneering exploring of the Arctic and the Antarctic.
