Soph Decree Lifts Shave Ban For Yearbook

Richard K. McLaughlin, president of the Class of 1952, issued the following edict yesterday concerning the relationship of sophomore beards to Oregana pictures:

"Sophomore men whose Oregana pictures are scheduled for this week may shave, if they really want to, in order to achieve a better photographic effect. However, they will be expected to resume the cultivation of beards immediately following their picture appointments."

Men affected include those living in Campbell Club, Sigma, Omega, and Sherry Ross Halls, and

those belonging to Yeomen. President McLaughlin's statement came after Oregana Editor Larry Davidson and Associate Editor Ruth Landry had protested that beards would definitely detract from the Oregana's All-American prospects for 1950.

V.A. Red Tape Cut for Thesis
