# Students, Wives Get OSC Game Reserved Seats

The Athletic Department announced Friday the reservation of 700 seats at the Oregon State game for wives and husbands of students.

The move coincided with announcement that the game is a sell-out and no more tickets are available.

To obtain these tickets, students should call at the Athletic Business Office on October 26 and 27 between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. The remaining tickets not sold to the students will be used to complete unfilled orders now on hand.

Since the game is an all-reserved one and no general admission tickets are available, it will be necessary to charge the regular price for these tickets, according to Howard Lemons, business manager. His statement followed conferences with federal tax officials. The policy is the same as followed by other Pacific Coast schools for their "big games."

For other home games, student wives and husbands have been able to purchase general admission tickets and sit in the student section.

However, so many students are expected to attend the Oregon State game that there will be no extra seats over what are normally provided by ASUO policy for returning Order of the O men and the University band.

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
