Husky Pups Roll Over Frosh 59-13

Oregon's Frosh grid squad dropped from the unbeaten ranks last Saturday in Seattle when the University of Washington Pups smothered the Ducklings, 59 to 13.

Bill Bowerman's freshmen team came loose at the seams as the Husky yearlings smashed over the goal line five times in the first half before the Oregon lads could tally.

Scoring three touchdowns in the initial period and two in the second quarter, the Washington eleven allowed the Ducklings only one counter in the starting half. With time running out, Hal Dunham heaved a 33 yd. pass to speedy Phil Turner for a touchdown.

Aided by Oregon fumbles, the Pups roared to four touchdowns in the last half, two in each quarter. Quarterback Sam Mitchell and Jack Nugent guided the Husky freshmen to their third consecutive victory, each crossing into paydirt twice.

Doug McClary and Bob Short racked up tallies by hauling in touchdown passes while Bill Eearly, Dick Sandberg, and Larry Smith each scooted into the endzone for the Pups. Sure-footed Bob Garvin kicked four conversions.

Mustering their strength just before the conclusion of the game, the Ducklings too to the airplanes as Norm Fenton tossed to Monte Brethauer, accounting for 33 yds. and a score for the Eugene crew. Wayne Parsons booted one extra point for the Ducklings.

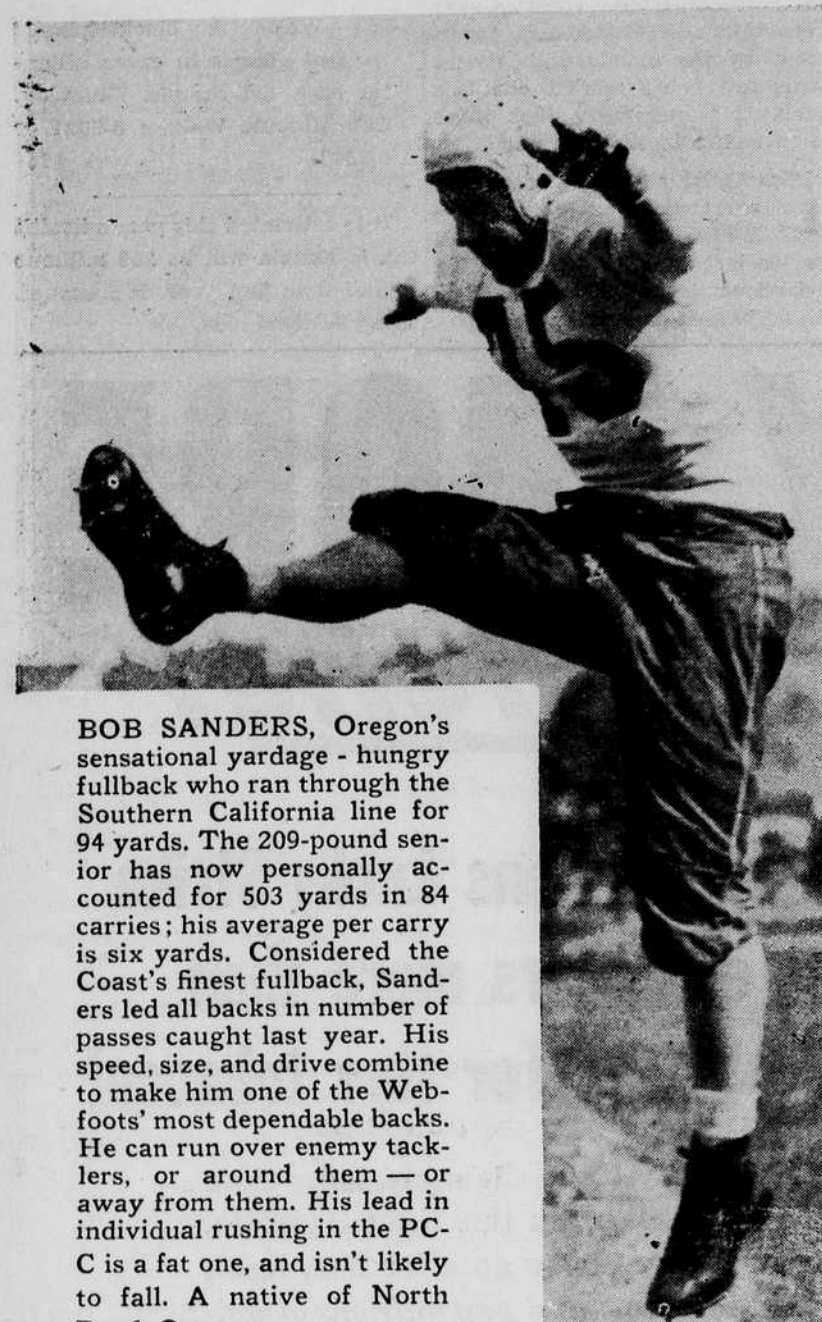
But UCLA, like the Bears, is undefeated in PCC play and a win Saturday here would give them the

Oregon's Hopes Die, Lose to USC 40-13

In a do-or-die football game Saturday, USC did it—Oregon died; at least Oregon's hopes for the Rose Bowl did.

"It was just one of those strings of heartbreaking venets that are part of the game," Coach Jim Aiken commented Monday. He had no excuses for the defeat; there was no particular point in the game or change in the Trojan's play that brought on the second half avalanche of touchdowns.

Meanwhile, Coach Aiken is pointing for this Saturday's intersectional tangle with the University of Iowa, at Iowa City. The Hawkeyes turned in a stunning upset over Northwestern, and observers reported that the Iowans had improved with every ball game since losing their opener to UCLA.

Aiken showed movies of the Southern California game to the Webfoots Monday afternoon, and explained the Iowa play patterns brought back by Buster McClure who scouted the Iowa-Northwestern game.

The Hawks made good use of a short passing play against the Wildcats, and displayed a well-rounded running attack. Oregon's coaching staff pondered over chalk, blackboard and movies Monday night, determining the most efficient defense to use against Dr. Ed Anderson's team.

Despite his squad's defeat, Bob Sanders bulldozed through the Men of Troy for 94 yards to boost his season's total yardage to 503 on 84

carries. His average gain per carry is an even six yards.

Darrell Robinson, Oregon left end, moved up to within easy striking distance of the Pacific Coast conference record for number of passes caught in one season. The standing mark was established last year by Dick Wilkins, who hauled in 27 Van Brocklin tosses in 10 games. Robinson presently has 20, with four games left to play.

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
