Duck-Beaver Football Classic Today

Ann Judson, Delts Win Sign Contest

OSC Team Civil War Favorites

Two high-scoring football machines, both keyed to the sky for today's 1949 finale, clash on Hayward Field at 2 p.m.

More than 23,000 fans will witness the contest, which is chapter 53 in the Oregon-Oregon State gridiron Civil War.

Coach Jim Aiken's Webfoots, who've fought losing battles with five opponents this year, will be after their third straight win over the Beavers. But previous records mean little in this classic series. Fighting underdogs have won many times in the past.

BEAVERS FAVORED

Kip Taylor and his single-wing Orangemen go into the game as one-touchdown favorites. The Beavers have defeated five of their last six foes.

Today's game will be the last in collegiate togs for 30 players. Fourteen Ducks and 16 Aggies end their PCC careers, and are pledged to lead their team in victory.

OSC STARS

Both squads lack nothing in the way of offensive scoring power. Ken Carpenter, an All-American candidate, will spark Oregon State from his left-half position. End Stan McGuire, two sophomores, Bill Sheffold and Gene Morrow, Dick Twenge and Dick Gray are other Beaver standouts.

Oregon's attack is moulded around a solid backfield, including Fullback Bob Sanders, who leads the conference in rushing, Woodley Lewis, George Bell, Johnny McKay, and Earl Stelle. McKay, however, may be out with injuries. End Darrell Robinson, record-breaking pass-receiver, will lead the passing attack.

Defensive line play could prove to be the victory key this afternoon. Both lines are evenly matched, with veterans at every position.
