

'Quartet' to Run 5-Day Series

"Quartet," the British film which will be second on the series sponsored by the Foreign Movie Club, will be shown at the Mayflower Theater tomorrow through Wednesday, with a matinee tomorrow afternoon and two showings nightly.

Basil Radford, Mai Zetterling, and Jack Watling are three of the stars in the production of four of W. Somerset Maugham's greatest stories.

Produced by J. Arthur Rank, two of the stories are comedies, one is ironic, and the other poignant.

Maugham introduces the movie, and background music is provided by the Philharmonic Orchestra of London, with a popular young British pianist, Eileen Joyce, as soloist.

"Quartet" is accompanied by a March of Time feature, "Report on the Atom."

New Rules Given For Air Training

Single men with two years or more of college training may apply for air force cadet pilot and navigator training under new eligibility requirements, Capt. Junior F. Klein announced yesterday.

Applicants must be between 20 and 26½ years of age and must pass an examining board, Klein, head of the Eugene Army and Air Force recruiting station, said.

Graduates of the year course receive reserve commissions as second lieutenants in the Air Force and are given a flying assignment after 30 days vacation with pay. Benefits Klein listed included flying instruction, food, clothing, housing, medical and dental care, and a \$10,000 insurance policy with premiums paid by the government while the cadet is in training.

Application papers and information are available at the recruiting office in the Armory, Seventh and Oak Street.

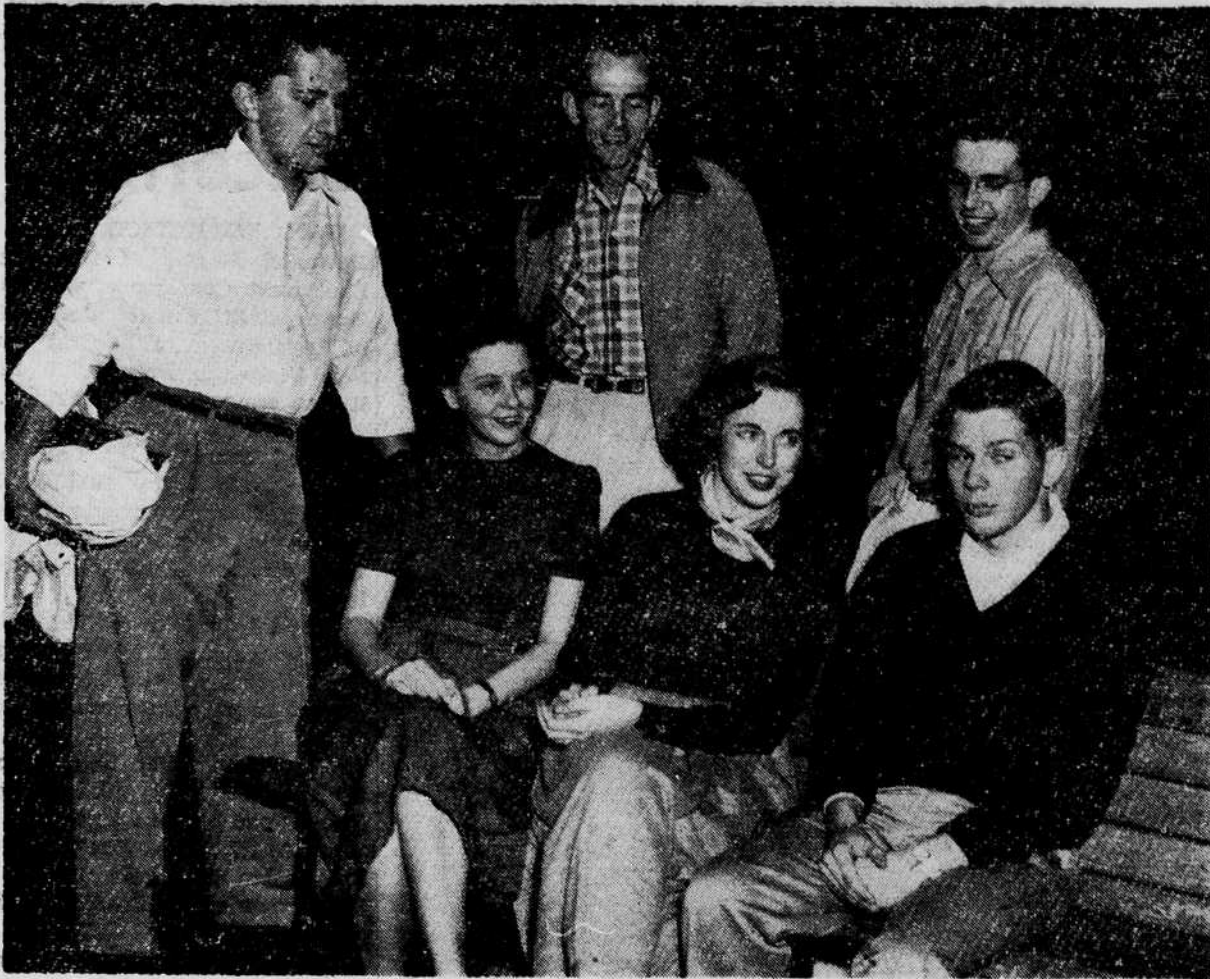

On his way east Newburn will stop in Spokane for the Northwest Regional Conference on Higher Education. He will address the convention Monday on "Trends in Higher Education Support."

Upon returning to Portland Dec. 12, he will attend the meeting of the State Board of Higher Education.

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Dr. Wolff Talks On Goethe's Life

The entire life of Goethe was an unbroken series of errors, Dr. Hans Wolff of the University of California faculty declared Thursday night in a lecture on the poet's personality.

"Goethe is said to be an Olympian—to be above the trials and tribulations of ordinary mortals," Wolff said, "but actually he was a passionate and emotional man. In spite of his weaknesses, the term Olympian is not without meaning, however, since objectivity and tranquility were the roles he assigned himself in life."

The occasion celebrated the bi-centennial of Goethe who lived from 1749 to 1832.

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
