Registration Extended One Week

Students will be allowed the first week of winter term to complete registration, rather than just Jan. 3, according to a change made in registration processes, Registrar Clifford L. Constance reported Tuesday.

The new deadline for completing registration steps is 12 noon, Jan. 7. Students failing to comply with this deadline will be assessed the late fee of \$5 on and after Jan. 9.

Deadline for completion of the student affairs check is Saturday noon. Students failing to check with Student Affairs by this time will be assessed the full \$5 late fee on Jan. 3.

Graduate or part time students (those taking six or less hours)

are not required to complete the Student Affairs check on Saturday. They may complete registration anytime during the regular period.

Advance registration also ends Saturday morning. The regular registration period extends from Jan. 3 to 12 noon, Jan. 14.

Validation for veterans and fee assessment for all students will take place in McArthur Court on Jan. 3 only. All fee payments involving money will be made in Emerald Hall.




