

Dixieland Jazz Band Excites 850 Fans at Mac Court Monday Night

A crowd of 850 shouting, clapping, whistling, foot-stomping dixieland enthusiasts were excited by two hours of the pulsating jazz of Nappy Lamare and the Bobcats at McArthur Court Monday night.

The show which was highlighted by Zutty Singleton's dynamic drumming, Bud Brown's ribald tenor, and Brad Gowan's ever fluent valve trombone was the first of its kind to be produced in Mac Court. It was also the first venture of the newly organized Student Union board.

Nappy "Don't Call Me Boy" Lamare kept his banjo away from the solo spotlight except for an occasional bit of sprightly double-timing reminiscent of Bob Crosby

days. However, Nappy's excellent fronting of this informal Bobcat bunch did not belie his attested shyness which was responsible for having a student announcer—Fred Young.

An extra treat was in the trim package of singer Patty O'Connor who received a tremendous tribute for her interpretive "Balling the Jack" and "If I Could Be With You."

Clarinetist Johnny Costello, who had the distinction of being with the Memphis Five when they first introduced jazz to Canada, proved his reputation as one of the country's foremost dixielanders and added his facile "Clarinet Marmalade" to the melange.

Stew Pletcher was plagued with

valve trouble through the evening and the entire group at one time or another attempted to fix his ailing trumpet. Incidentally, though Stew denounces bebop, he admitted he enjoyed the vocal bopping of Jack Dalk and Dick Barber who were programmed during the first intermission.

More talent from ASUO talent file was included at the second intermission when Jerry Crary and Con Sheffer pleased the audience with their fiddle-uke duets.

Rounding out the band was Harry Gillingham's piano and Bud "Goat" Hatch with his bass horn.

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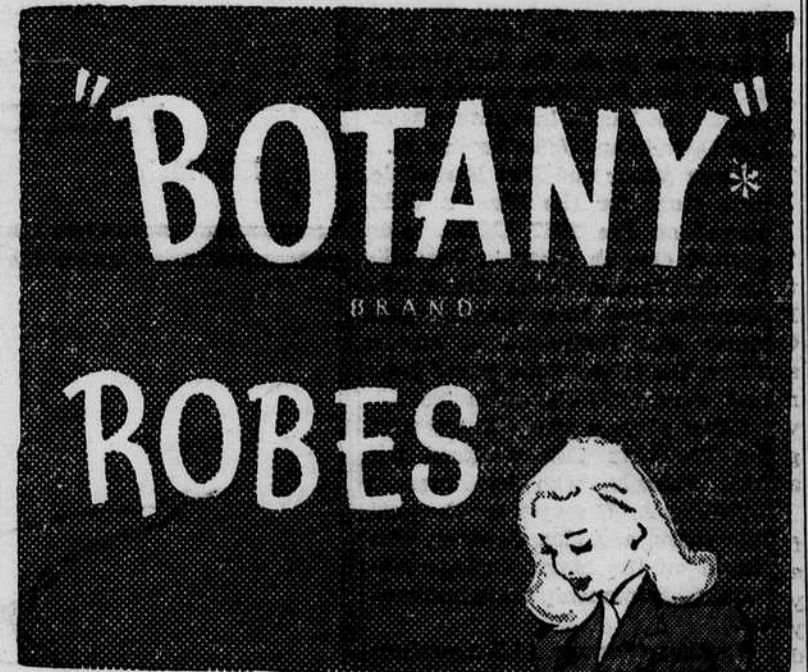
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
