

Ducks Play Blue 'n Gold Pro Team

Oregon's basketball Ducks, after two defeats at the hands of Utah State and the University of Utah last weekend, will face the Oakland Blue 'n Gold Nuggets AAU team this Friday and Saturday in McArthur Court.

The Oakland club, formerly the Oakland Bitners, holds the National AAU championship, the Mexican International Championship, the Philippine Invitational Championship, the American Basketball League championship, and the Pacific AAU championship.

Six players on the Blue 'n Gold club will be familiar to Northwest hoop fans.

Chuck Hanger and Mike O'Neil were in McArthur Court about a year ago with the University of California Bears. On the University of San Francisco squad which played the Ducks last season were Hal DeJulio and John Benington.

Dave Minor and Don Barksdale, both stars for the Blue 'n Gold, played on the 1947 UCLA team against Oregon State in Corvallis for the Pacific Coast Conference championship. Now playing with Minor and Barksdale is Morrie Silver, the tricky little guard from that same OSC champion team.

Other players who will toy with the Webfoots this weekend are Dick Fasholz, who has been a top flight AAU player for the past four years, and Ken Gardner, who played on the Marin College National Championship team last season.

Another former All-American with the Oakland team is Dave Mariani, who played for Santa Clara. Walt Moreno also played with the National champ Marin College team. The remaining man on the squad is Cal Reimcke.

Barksdale, Hanger, Mariana, Minor, and Silver are former All-Americans.

Coach for the Oakland club is Eob Alameida, who at 28 rates as being one of the youngest big time coaches in basketball.

Last year the Oakland Blue 'n Gold Nuggets won 66 games and lost one. That's right, they lost just one game, to the YMI team of San Francisco, which they later beat in three games by large scores.

Webfoot Coach John Warren will probably start his team of Eob Amacher, center; Will Urban and Mel Streeter, forwards; and Paul Sowers and Mel Krause, guards against the Blue 'n Gold.

Also likely to see action this weekend are Paul Cooper, Bob Lavey, Bob Don, Jack Keller, and John Neely.

Warren said yesterday that he was satisfied with his team's performance last weekend against the two Salt Lake City teams, with the exception of a few of the finer points. The head coach stated that he rated Sowers as the best man on the team in those games.

As the games this weekend develop into obvious wins for the polished Oakland team, most of the Oregon squad will probably enter the game. Regular reserves last year who may see action Friday and Saturday are Dick Unis, Dale Warberg, and Lynn Hamilton.

gated by the Executive Council. Weekly programs will begin next term when campus station KDUK begins regular operation.
