## U.O. to Release Book on Awards At Start of Week

"Scholarships to the University of Oregon," a publication listing all scholarships available to U.O. students, will be released the first of this week, Lyle Nelson, director of information, has announced.

The book will name all scholarships and awards, giving methods of applying, qualifications, and amounts, Nelson said.

Several scholarships new this year are included. Among these are four \$500 awards given by Standard Oil of California to a student from each class. The Joseph and Eva Zimmerman \$500 scholarship will be awarded for the first time in fall, 1950, by the Scholarship Committee.

"Such a publication has always been needed," Nelson pointed out. "Never before has the list been so complete and so readily available."

The publication is a result of combining all committees concerning scholarship into the single Scholarship and Financial Aid Committee, of which Karl Onthank, director of the graduate placement service, is chairman.

The book will be sent to all Oregon high schools. University students may obtain it through the Office of Student Affairs.
