

Library Exhibits Mexican Articles

Mexican handicraft articles, collected by Glenn Morgan, graduate student in political science on a study tour last summer, are now on display in the main lobby of the University library.

Morgan acquired the articles while studying at the University of Mexico.

Among unusual items included are a figurine of iridescent obsidian that changes from black to gold when turned in the light, and a Jai-alai, a basket used in a Mexican game similar to handball.

Grotesque ceremonial masks, bullfight souvenirs, castanets, a tiny pottery tea set, and a mortar and pestle carved from lava are also shown in the exhibit.
