The USA junior representative also expressed interest in the possibility of expansion of such intramural activities as track, which has been tried only experimentally so far.

Virginia Wright, sophomore representative and USA member, urged the careful defining of powers of the Executive Council and the new Student Union Board, so that "final authority will rest with elected representatives."

More publicity on the council's actions was urged by Miss Wright, so that student apathy and mis-

doings might be avoided. She added that this could also serve as a check on "the possibility of the council's playing politics."

"The council should be run for the good of the students rather than that of individual parties,' she asserted.

Miss Wright also pledged herself to carry on the project of her predecessor, Ron Brown (particularly boxes for student suggestions), and to investigation of the honor system, with an eye toward its eventual installation here.
