

VA Insurance Checks Mailed

The Veterans Administration began mailing out G.I. insurance dividend checks on Jan. 16 to 16 million veterans eligible to their share of the \$2,800,000,000 dividend fund. With checks being sent out at the rate of approximately 200,000 a day, the VA plans to complete payments by the end of June.

Veterans who haven't received their checks are advised not to worry or write by VA officials. Checks will closely follow the sending of acknowledgement cards, in-

Kappa Rho Omicron, radio honorary, will meet tonight on the third floor of Villard at 8 o'clock. All members are requested to attend as important business will be

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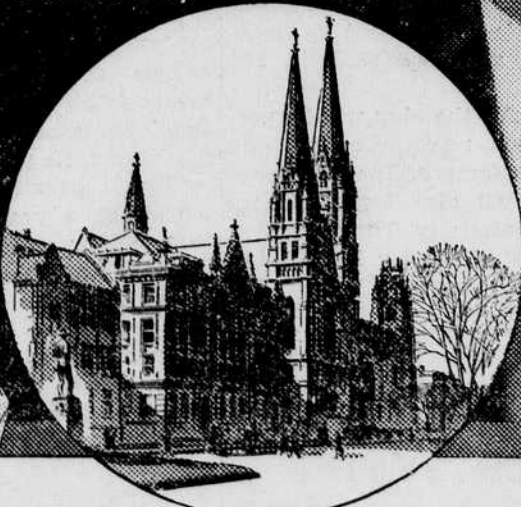
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
