Elbridge Sibley, of the Social Science Research Council in Washington, D.C., is on the campus today meeting with University officials.


Executive associate in charge of administration of fellowships and grants-in-aid for the council, Sibley will hold conferences throughout the day.

He is visiting 18 universities to discover persons who might potentially be Fellows of the Social Science Research Council—either predoctoral or postdoctoral. The council awards grants for research work to certain university professors.

At noon he will be honored at a luncheon at the Anchorage Cafe, where President Harry K. Newburn will preside. Others at the luncheon will be R. D. Clark, assistant to the dean of the College of Liberal Arts; heads of the social science departments, and staff members.


