For Weather Commentators

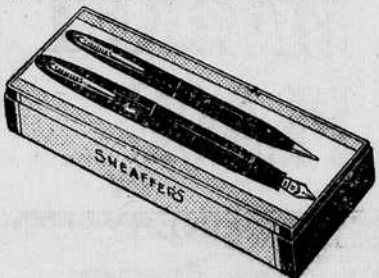
1. Keep 'em short; nobody's going to stop and listen.

shots, and connected on 11 of them. Warberg has an even .600 average from the free throw line and ranks fifth in point per game average. He is sixth, however, in total points scored.

Jim Vranizan has potted 36 points in his first seven college games, placing him just five ahead of Warberg and five behind Mel Krause, Oregon's fourth highest scorer.

Bob Amacher, who has seen action in only two games, has dropped in two field goals in three shots for a .667 average. Paul Cooper, appearing the same number of games, is shooting .500 ball on two buckets in four attempts.
