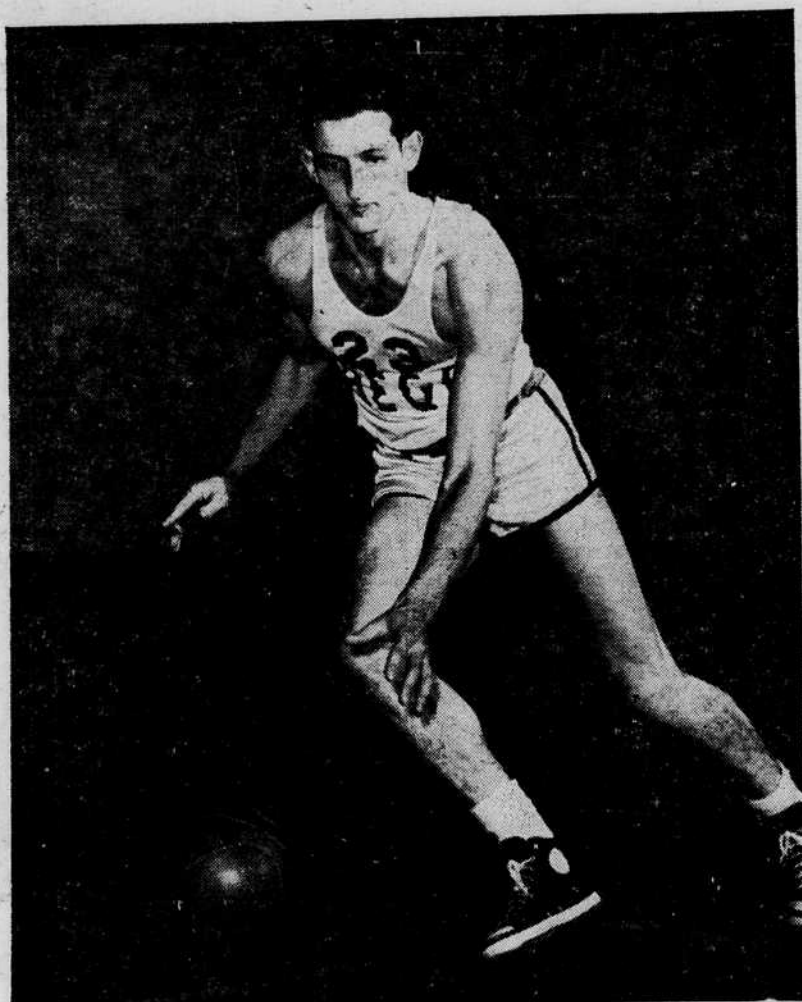

With its second northern division championship in three years already assured, Oregon State's powerful wrestling team will host Vanport college of Portland in a return meet in the men's gym here Saturday afternoon.

Bob Antonacci's Beavers established themselves as strong contenders for the Pacific coast crown this season when they knocked off the defending PCC champion Washington State Cougars, 15-11, at Pullman last weekend.

The day before the touring Oregon blanked Eastern Washington college of Cheney, 36-0. Next big test for the Beavers will be against California on the home mats Feb. 25.

Biggest surprise of the WSC meet was Sophomore Bill Mosby's decision over the Cougar's Harry Gust, defending conference champion in the 165-pound class. Other Orange victories, all by decisions, were recorded by Herb Haberlach, defending PCC heavyweight title holder; Paul Buhler, 175; Don Whitbeck, 155; and Tom Cutshall, 136.
